Documentation

Version 1 (Maryland)

A person may not drive any vehicle while the person is impaired by any controlled substance, if the person is not entitled to use the controlled substance under the laws of this State.

Version 2 (Virginia)

It shall be unlawful to operate a motor vehicle while under the influence of any narcotic drug or any other self-administered drug, to a degree which impairs the ability to operate the motor vehicle safely.

Version 3 (Arizona)

It shall be unlawful to drive under the influence of any drug or substance if the person is impaired to the slightest degree.
